RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Association abides by the Royal Agricultural Association of NZ rules and regulations. For all rules in their entirety please visit www.ras.org.nz. A copy of the rules will be available from the Secretary's Office on show day but have been abbreviated below to save space for printing purposes. Any enquiries, please contact The Secretary.

ENTRIES:

Close 5.00pm Monday the 3rd of March 2025 (late entries will not be accepted). Entries should be in the hands of the Event Administrator, by the above date. There will be no entry or class changes after the 19th of March 2025.

Entries for Flowers, Forage Crops and Vegetables may be made on Show Day. All entries must be accompanied with the appropriate entry fees.

LIVESTOCK CLASSES:

Each exhibit must have been the bona fide property of exhibitor for not less than one month prior to the Show except in the case of imported stock.

To save congestion at the measuring pen, a current Canterbury Agricultural and Pastoral Show or Royal Agricultural Show or Life Certificate will be accepted from exhibitors in all horse classes where height is stipulated.

Refund of Entry Fees in the Horse Section: The Association will credit 80% of entries only on production of a Veterinary Certificate or presentation of a Medical Certificate for the rider.

The request for refunds must be in the hands of the Event Administrator within seven days of the date of the Show.

In respect of District Classes, the District is defined by the former Malvern County Boundaries, and exhibitors in these classes must permanently reside in the Malvern County area.

HORSE SECTION:

Please note that there are changes and alterations in this Section. The former "Malvern County" has been further defined by Roads and

additional information with regard to the wearing of helmets, as regulated by the Royal Agricultural Society, has also been included. Please read these regulations carefully since noncompliance may render your entry as invalid.

HATS AND SAFETY HELMETS

a) In all cases current WorkSafe New Zealand rules prevail.

b) All riders, including harness drivers/with the exclusion of heavy horse (Clydesdale) working classes, competing at RAS affiliated A&P Shows/Events must wear protective headgear, which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area, collecting rings or anywhere else within a Showgrounds or the grounds of an affiliated Event.

c) Hats/helmets must conform with one of the current approved safety standards. These standards may be subject to change, but the latest list can be found at <http://www.ras.org.nz> – equestrian. RAS will advise any changes via their website and Facebook.

d) All hats/helmets that conform as per c) must be identified by the current tag system implemented by NZPCA, ESNZ and RAS.

Helmet compliance is the responsibility of the rider/parent.

YELLOW TAGGED HELMETS ARE MANDATORY FOR ALL RIDERS WHEN MOUNTED. NO YELLOW TAG - NO ENTRY INTO THE RING - NO EXCEPTION

Breastplate number holders -

are compulsory for all classes, except Hunter jumping and Pony Hunter jumping. The competitor is responsible for making the number using the appropriate number that the show issues. Only large black numbers on a white background are acceptable. No other colour formats are acceptable.

Hunter Jumpers & Recreational (Leisure) Horses & Ponies are required to use the Association numbers. The \$4 is to be paid with entry fee, \$2 of which is refundable on the return of the Back Number in good condition.

YELLOW CARD SYSTEM:

This show/event supports the RAS "Yellow Card" system. A Yellow Card will be issued in cases of offences in respect of abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour, as per the RAS Constitution and the RAS Rules and Regulations/Bylaws, including the Equestrian Rule Book, the RAS affiliated Show/Event/Registered Measuring Stand and their grounds and their duly appointed delegates, may deliver to the Person Responsible a Yellow Warning Card (either immediately or within 10 days of the show) which suspends any penalty until possible new offences. Full wording on the "Yellow Card System" is available to view on the RAS website www.ras.org.nz.

ARREARS:

No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions, or any other Show/Event charge, is eligible to compete at any affiliated Show/Event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted.

SUMMARY OF RAS RESOLUTION PROCESS:

The full process can be found on the RAS website www.ras.org.nz. The principle behind the process is to deal with the matter as it comes to hand and in most cases it should be dealt with directly by the show. If the matter is in regards to an RAS official, the show may request the assistance of RAS Head Office as to how to deal with this in an appropriate manner.

SEEDS, GRAIN, ROOTS & VEGETABLES:

In Sections 8, 9, 10 and 11 all entries must be the bona fide property of, and grown by, exhibitor for the current season.

EXHIBITS:

Must be in their appointed places before 9.30am (unless stated otherwise by individual Sections), on the morning of the Show. No exhibits of any description will be allowed to be removed from the Show grounds until 4.00pm on the day of the Show without the permission of the Committee or Secretary. Any exhibits not removed on show day will become property of the Association.

Persons desirous of exhibiting goods for which there are no classes in the Catalogue may, subject to the approval of the Committee, obtain sites on the ground on the payment of a small premium.

Persons in charge of exhibits will be admitted free upon producing an Exhibitor's Pass, and they shall be subject to the orders of the Committee or its Officers.

In cases where non-members exhibitor's entry fees amount to a minimum of \$15.00, such exhibitors will be entitled to an Exhibitor's Pass. Every \$100.00 spent on entries shall receive one ticket thereafter if required. Members receive two Member Entry Passes.

Should an exhibitor, in the opinion of the Committee, be guilty of any fraudulent or unfair practice, or any deceit or concealment in entering or exhibiting stock or any other, or exhibit diseased or infected stock, all the exhibits of such an exhibitor shall be disqualified, and his/her name shall not appear in the official prize list.

Should any exhibitor infringe any of these conditions and regulations or refuse to comply with the direction of the Committee, the Committee shall have power to suspend such person or firm from exhibiting at any exhibition during such period as they may think fit.

Should any person or firms be disqualified or suspended by a kindred Association registered under the Agricultural and Pastoral Societies Act, 1908. The Committee of the Association shall have power to endorse such disqualifications or suspension and suspend such person or firm accordingly.

ENTRY FEE FOR SPECIAL PRIZES:

Are the same as those in Classes to which such Prizes relate or are otherwise specified.

LIABILITY:

The Committee will not, under any circumstances, hold themselves responsible for loss, damage, or mis-delivery of exhibits of any description, whether exhibited at the Show or during transit to or from same.

Parking is entirely at the owner's own risk. The Association's policy is that due care has been taken to protect property and grounds, however the Association will not be held liable to any person in case of loss, theft, injury or damage by

reason of any defect, accident, negligence or neglect howsoever arising.

Evacuation Procedure Areas: The Main Ring and the Car Park.

PRIZE MONEY:

In the event of the funds at the disposal of the committee proving insufficient (owing to unforeseen circumstances) to pay all the prizes in full, the committee reserves the right to withhold such a percentage as may be necessary.

All prizes not claimed within two weeks after the Show Date shall be forfeited.

The Committee reserves the right to substitute trophies in lieu of cash prizes should any offers of same come to hand after having the Schedule printed.

TROPHIES:

All Trophies for all sections can be viewed on Show Day upstairs in the Pavilion. Trophy winners may have their photo taken with the trophy on the day, but all Trophies will remain with the Association and not to be removed from the grounds.

PROTESTS:

These must be lodged with the Event Administrator in writing not later than one hour after the Judges have given their decisions. The party entering the protest must deposit \$50.00, which will be returned if the protest is upheld. The Committee will meet on the day of the Show to consider all protests, five members to form a quorum. The decision of the Committee for the time being in office shall be absolutely final in all cases.

HEALTH AND SAFETY PLAN: A full copy of the Health and Safety Plan is held in the Secretary's office along with a map of the grounds and restricted zones, first aid area and fire extinguishers.

DOGS: NO DOGS will be admitted to the grounds unless they are collared and leashed.

The Malvern A&P Assn request that all dogs BE TREATED AS BELOW before entering the showgrounds.

Dose all dogs with a praziquantel drug at least

48 hours or within one month prior to going. Carry some evidence of treatment such as a treatment certificate or receipt from vet. Carry enough plastic bags to pick up and remove dog faeces should your dog defecate.

If you are going on public land near sheep pasture please apply the same policies to prevent the spread of sheep measles. If you are in doubt or have questions contact Ovis Management on 0800 222 011 or visit www.sheepmeasles.co.nz.

CATTLE— MYCOPLASMA BOVIS – MALVERN A&P ASSN SHOW PROTOCOLS

Exhibitors

1. Animals on properties under any suspicion of exposure to *Mycoplasma bovis* should not be transported to shows and events.
2. Animals showing clinical signs of **ANY** disease should not be transported to shows, as per normal biosecurity practice.
3. Make sure your cattle are tagged and registered with **NAIT**.
4. Keep your **NAIT** movements up-to- date and accurate and record movements to and from the event. Guidance is available on www.nait.co.nz.
5. Practice good on-farm biosecurity and clean and disinfect outerwear, boots and equipment before attending a show or event. On your return, clean and disinfect again before taking outerwear, boots and equipment back onto your farm. For more information refer to the guidance on www.mpi.govt.nz/bovis
6. Animals without a NAIT tag will be denied entry to the event and non-compliance will be reported to MPI.
7. Ensure that the stalls at the event are clean when you arrive and when you leave. USE the SAME stall - do not use a different stall belonging to a different exhibitor at any time during the event.

8. Give animals individual water – do not allow animals to drink from shared water troughs.
9. Keep your cattle herd separate from other exhibitor's cattle and **do not** allow nose to nose contact.
10. Each Stud/Farm to use a separate wash bay/area.
11. Ensure that when your animals are tied in the stalls they are being securely managed by someone who is strong and skilled enough.

- Champion points will not be awarded where there is no competition. Competition shall mean two or more exhibits.
- In the event of a tie, e.g. 1st equal, the points for 1st and 2nd place are added together and divided; likewise, points for 2nd and 3rd are divided in a 2nd equal placing.
- In cases where entries are made in the names of different members of one family, this must be clearly marked, e.g. – *AB Jones Family* and this will go into the Malvern Mounted Rifles' family competition. All entries made individually will go into the Johnson Family Salver competition.
- Where two persons tie in the number of points for a trophy, the number of first placings shall decide the winner.
- The Malvern A&P Show will be run under RAS rules.

Horses

Entry Fees: Members \$6.00 Non-members \$9.00

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING ENTRY FEES:

\$1.25 per class per horse has been included to cover RAS charges and levies.

PLEASE NOTE: THERE WILL BE NO CHANGES MADE TO ANY ENTRIES AFTER WEDNESDAY THE 19TH OF MARCH - NO EXCEPTIONS

Breastplate number holders are compulsory for all classes, except Hunter jumping, Pony Hunter jumping and Recreational (Leisure) Horse & Pony. The competitor is responsible for making the number using the appropriate number that the show issues. Only large black numbers on a white background are acceptable. No other colour combinations or formats are acceptable. Back numbers are \$4 and are to be paid for with the entry fees. The back numbers are to be collected from the Administrator's Office, (upstairs in the Pavillion), and returned to the Administrator's Office (in good condition) for a \$2 refund.

Please Note:

1. All competitors and exhibitors ride and exhibit at their own risk.
2. It is intended that we irrigate, however, this is dependent on District By Laws at the time.
3. Information re safety helmets.
4. Boundaries for our District.
5. Horses/Ponies 3 years and under must not be ridden.
6. Age of Riders/Handler/Horses/Ponies are as at 1 August 2024

Horse Section Rules & Regulations:

(1) ALL CLASSES ARE RUN UNDER RAS RULES

(2) HEIGHT CERTIFICATES AND MEASURING:

All exhibitors (with the exception of the Recreational (Leisure) Horse & Pony Section) must carry an official RAS Life or Horse/Pony Annual Height and Performance Card, or Malvern A&P Assn Temporary Measuring Certificate (TMC). Failure to do so will result in elimination.

Measuring for a TMC, is for Malvern Show

District Boundary Competitors only, will be available on the grounds. Only horses/ponies presented in a bridle and under suitable control will be measured for a TMC, between 7.30am until 8.15am. \$10 per horse/ pony to be paid at time of measuring (cash only).

(3) CLEAN SPORT:

Clean Sport - The rules of the Royal A&P Society New Zealand in regard to Clean Sport apply. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show/Event and that testing of all animals is at the person responsible's risk. Forbidden Substance - Any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardio-vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, musculoskeletal or urogenital systems.

(4) NOVICE CLASSIFICATION

A Novice is a Horse or Pony which has not won 6 firsts in conformation classes at any A & P Show at the time of the Show (Ladies and Gentleman's Hack class wins DO NOT count as an Open Conformation win and are not recorded). If a Novice entry has gained 6 wins by the day of the Show, the Competitor must advise the Secretary and may change to an Open class within the Sub-Section, or if no class remains to enter a refund which will be actioned after the Show.

A Novice Hunter is a Horse or Pony which has not won 6 firsts in Hunter Jumping. Please note that a record of wins will be asked for. Horse/Pony height and performance cards must be carried. Failure to do so will result in elimination. Central Districts of the RAS collates all A & P Show results to enable Secretaries to keep a record of all Novice wins. Novices may enter the Open Classes.

(5) It is compulsory for all stallions and colts, except foals, to wear **two (2)** official "S" identification badges. One attached to each side of their bridle, at all Shows /Events at all times. The rider/handler must also wear **two (2)** RAS official armbands (one on each arm) when in the ring. "S" badges are to be purchased from RAS Head Office or ESNZ; armbands are available from RAS Head Office. Handlers and Riders of stallions/colts must wear an approved Hi Viz vest at Shows/Events when outside the show ring. Vests can be purchased from RAS Head Office.

(6) DISTRICT RULE

Horse and rider must reside in District to compete in District Classes.

DEFINITION OF MALVERN DISTRICT COUNTY:
(Formerly Old Malvern County)

Area between the Waimakariri River to the Rakaia River. West side of Intake Road, South side of the Old West Coast Road from Intake Road to Sandy Knolls Road; West side of Sandy Knolls Road down to West side of Aylesbury Road to Burnham. West side of Main South Road from Burnham to the Selwyn River up to Mitchells Road, a line from corner of Hororata/Dunsandel Road to Te Pirita Road, West side of Te Pirita Road down to Rakaia Terrace Road, from North side of Rakaia Terrace Road up to Steels Road; West side of Steels Road to the Rakaia River.

(7) OWNERSHIP

All horses and ponies entered in competitive classes or ring events or parading must be in the name of the bona fide owner. All animals must be named at time of entry.

(8) LEASES

Leases or partnerships must be for no less than a six-month period and shall commence and must be lodged with the RAS.

(9) HATS AND SAFETY HELMETS

a) In all cases current WorkSafe New Zealand rules prevail.

b) All riders, including harness drivers/with the exclusion of heavy horse (Clydesdale) working classes, competing at RAS affiliated A&P Shows/Events must wear protective headgear, which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area, collecting rings or anywhere else within a Showgrounds or the grounds of an affiliated Event.

c) Hats/helmets must conform with one of the current approved safety standards. These standards may be subject to change but the latest list can be found at <http://www.ras.org.nz> – equestrian. RAS will advise any changes via their website and Facebook.

(11) A JUDGE'S TRAVEL FUND has also been introduced to assist with judges' travelling expenses at \$5 per competitor/exhibitor.

(12) The committee has the right to amalgamate classes if insufficient entries.

(13) If fewer than three entries in a class, then only second prize money will be paid out. Horses are only eligible for one section. However, riders can enter their rider class in whichever applicable section.

(14) RIGHTS OF THE COMMITTEE - The committee reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry without giving any reason for doing so and reserves the right to make any alteration to the show timetable or withdraw any event as may be deemed desirable. If there are insufficient entries in a class at close of entries, classes may be combined. Any unruly or dangerous animal or exhibit may be required to leave the showgrounds.
