IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING ENTRY

FEES: \$1.15 per class per horse has been included to cover RAS charges and levies.

Breastplate number holders are compulsory for all classes, except Hunter jumping, Pony Hunter jumping and Recreational (pleasure) Horse & Pony. The competitor is responsible for making the number using the appropriate number that the show issues. Only large black numbers on a white background are acceptable. No other colour combinations or formats are acceptable. Back numbers are to be collected from the horse caravan (ringside) and returned to the secretary's office (in good condition) for a \$2 refund.

Please Note:

1. All competitors and exhibitors ride and exhibit at their own risk.
2. It is intended that we irrigate, however, this is dependent on District By Laws at the time.
3. Information re safety helmets.
4. Boundaries for our District.
5. All ridden horses/ponies must be 3 years of age or over.

Horse Section Rules & Regulations:

(1) ALL CLASSES ARE RUN UNDER RAS RULES

(2) HEIGHT CERTIFICATES AND MEASURING:

All exhibitors (with the exception of the Recreational (Pleasure) Horse & Pony Section) must carry an official RAS Life or Horse/Pony Annual Height and Performance Card, or Malvern A&P Assn Temporary Measuring Certificate (TMC). Failure to do so will result in elimination.

Measuring for a TMC, is for Malvern Show District Boundary Competitors only, will be available on the grounds. Only horses/ponies presented in a bridle and under suitable control will be measured for a TMC, between 7.30am until 8.15am. \$11 per horse/pony to be paid at time of measuring (cash only).

(3) CLEAN SPORT:

Clean Sport - The rules of the Royal A&P Society New Zealand in regard to Clean Sport apply. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show/Event and that testing of all animals is at the person responsible's risk. **Forbidden Substance** - Any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardio-vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, musculoskeletal or urogenital systems.

(4) NOVICE CLASSIFICATION

A Novice is a Horse or Pony which has not won 6 firsts

in conformation classes at any A & P Show at the time of the Show (Ladies and Gentleman's Hack class wins count as an Open Conformation win and must be recorded). If a Novice entry has gained 6 wins by the day of the Show, the Competitor must advise the Secretary and may change to an Open class within the Sub-Section, or if no class remains to enter, a refund which will be actioned after the Show.

A Novice Hunter is a Horse or Pony which has not won 6 firsts in Hunter Jumping. Please note that a record of wins will be asked for. Horse/Pony height and performance cards must be carried. Failure to do so will result in elimination. Central Districts of the RAS collates all A & P Show results to enable Secretaries to keep a record of all Novice wins. Novices may enter the Open Classes. All Novice Horses and Ponies to be ridden in a snaffle bit.

(5) It is compulsory for all stallions and colts, except foals, to wear two (2) official "S" identification badges. One attached to each side of their bridle, at all Shows /Events at all times. The rider/handler must also wear two (2) RAS official armbands (one on each arm) when in the ring. "S" badges are to be purchased from RAS Head Office or ESNZ; armbands are available from RAS Head Office. Handlers and Riders of stallions/colts must wear an approved Hi Viz vest at Shows/Events when outside the show ring. Vests can be purchased from RAS Head Office.

(6) DISTRICT RULE

Horse and rider must reside in District to compete in District Classes.

DEFINITION OF MALVERN DISTRICT COUNTY:
(Formerly Old Malvern County)

Area between the Waimakariri River to the Rakaia River. West side of Intake Road, South side of the Old West Coast Road from Intake Road to Sandy Knolls Road; West side of Sandy Knolls Road down to West side of Aylesbury Road to Burnham. West side of Main South Road from Burnham to the Selwyn River up to Mitchells Road, a line from corner of Hororata/Dunsandel Road to Te Pirita Road, West side of Te Pirita Road down to Rakaia Terrace Road, from North side of Rakaia Terrace Road up to Steels Road; West side of Steels Road to the Rakaia River.

(7) OWNERSHIP

All horses and ponies entered in competitive classes or ring events or parading must be in the name of the bona fide owner. All animals must be named at time of entry.

(8) LEASES

Leases or partnerships must be for no less than a six-month period and shall commence and must be lodged with the RAS.

(9) HATS AND SAFETY HELMETS

a) In all cases current WorkSafe New Zealand rules prevail.

b) All riders, including harness drivers/with the exclusion of heavy horse (Clydesdale) working classes, competing at RAS affiliated A&P Shows/Events must wear protective headgear, which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area, collecting rings or anywhere else within a

Showgrounds or the grounds of an affiliated Event.
c) Hats/helmets must conform with one of the current approved safety standards. These standards may be subject to change but the latest list can be found at <http://www.ras.org.nz> – equestrian. RAS will advise any changes via their website and Facebook.
d) All hats/helmets that conform as per c) must be identified by the current tag system implemented by NZPCA, ESNZ and RAS. **RED TAGGED HELMETS ARE MANDATORY FOR ALL RIDERS WHEN MOUNTED. NO RED TAG - NO ENTRY INTO THE RING - NO EXCEPTION**

Please note: As from 1 August 2023 standards are to be updated and a 'yellow' tag must be shown.

(10) A JUDGES TRAVEL FUND has also been introduced to assist with judges' travelling expenses at \$5 per competitor/exhibitor.

(11) The committee has the right to amalgamate classes if insufficient entries.

(12) If fewer than three entries in a class, then only second prize money will be paid out. Horses are only eligible for one section. However riders can enter their rider class in whichever applicable section.

(13) RIGHTS OF THE COMMITTEE - The committee reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry without giving any reason for doing so and reserves the right to make any alteration to the show timetable or withdraw any event as may be deemed desirable. If there are insufficient entries in a class at close of entries, classes may be combined. Any unruly or dangerous animal or exhibit may be required to leave the showgrounds.

Pattern for 'Muster the Lamb' Class 14016 – (no entry fee required)

A basic pattern for a small toy lamb suitable for babies and young children.

Use your imagination to make your lamb as individual as you like. Any accessories must be attached securely; features are to be embroidered – no buttons or beads please. Yarn and filling to be machine washable – have fun



Materials

Small amounts of DK yarn are used
Colour A for legs, arm, head and ears
Colour B for body
Scrap of black to embroider features
New, clean, washable toy stuffing
3.25mm knitting needles
Darning needle

Abbreviations

K knit
P purl
RS right side
WS wrong side
m1 make one stitch, lift loop between stitches and knit through back of the loop
kfb knit into the front and back of the next stitch (makes 1)
garter stitch knit all rows
st st stocking stitch, knit right side rows, purl wrong side rows
k2tog knit 2 stitches together
ssk slip 2 stitches knit wise one at a time, return to left needle and knit together through back of loops
sts stitches

The legs, body and head are knitted in one piece. The ears are knitted separately and sewn in place and the arm stitches are picked up after and knitted on.

Left leg (front)

In Colour A Cast on 4 sts

Row 1: purl

Row 2: k1, m1, k2, m1, k1 (6sts)

Row 3: purl

Row 4: k1, m1, k4, m1, k1 (8sts)

Row 5 to 17: starting with a purl row, work 13 rows in stocking stitch

Leave stitches on a spare needle

Right leg

Work as for left leg



Body (front)

Continue in Colour B

Transfer both legs onto one needle with RS facing

Row 1: Knit across both legs ensuring that both RS are facing the same way (16 sts)

Rows 2 to 31: Continue in garter stitch (all rows knit) for 30 rows

Row 32: WS facing – k2tog, k to last 2 sts, k2tog (14sts)

Row 33: K2tog, k to last 2 sts, K2tog (12 sts)

Row34: knit



Head (front)

Change yarn – Colour A

Rows 1 to 14 - 14 rows stocking stitch (12 sts)

Change yarn – Colour B

Row 15: k2tog, k to last 2 sts, k2tog (10 sts)

Row 16: knit

Row 17: k2tog, k to last 2 sts, k2tog (8 sts)

Row 18: knit

Row 19: kfb, knit to last st, kfb (10 sts)

Row 20: knit

Row 21: kfb, knit to last st, kfb (12 sts)

Row 22: Knit 1 row

Head (back)

Change yarn - Colour A

With RS facing

Rows 23 – 36 – 14 rows st st starting with a knit row (12 sts)

Body (back)

Change yarn to colour B

Row 1: knit

Row 2: kfb, k to last st, kfb (14 sts)

Row 3: kfb, k to last st, kfb (16 sts)

Rows 4 to 34 – garter st 31 rows (knit every row)

Ending with a WS row

Legs (back)

****Change to colour A**

Row 1: Knit 8, turn

Work 13 rows in st st on these 8 sts leaving the remaining stitches on a stitch holder

Row14: k1 , ssk, k2, k2tog, k1

Row15: purl

Row16: k1, ssk, k2tog, k1

Row 17: purl

Cut yarn approx. 15cm, thread through sts.

Re-join yarn and repeat from ** for second leg on remaining 8 stitches



Ears (make2)

In Colour A, cast on 4 sts

Row1: p4

Row 2: k4

Row 3: p4

Row 4: k2tog, ssk

Row 5: p2tog

Cut yarn approx. 15cm, fasten off last stitch and carry yarn down side of ear – on the opposite side to the cast on tail.



To make up

Attach ears securely to sides of head (front) using the tails

Fold lamb, right sides together at the head

Stitch seams using appropriate colours – both sides of head and shoulders, encasing the ear seam as you go.

Arms (make 2)

Open the two halves of the body and with RS facing, using colour B pick up 7 stitches below the shoulder on both sides of body, starting at one under arm and finishing at other under arm (14stitches)



Work 7 rows in garter st ending on a WS row

Change yarn to colour A with RS facing

Continue working in stocking st for 10 rows

Next row

K1, ssk, k2, k2tog, ssk, k2, k2tog, k1

Cut yarn approx. 15cm, thread through stitches to fasten off.



Continue making up

Fold body RS together and sew all remaining seams leaving one side of the body open to turn right side out,

Stuff using a knitting needle or chop stick to reach into arms and legs

Sew final seam.

Embroider the eyes, nose and mouth making sure ends are fastened securely within the stuffing

Using Colour A gently gather at neck using a running stitch and securely fastening ends if liked.



Feel free to personalise this basic pattern with your own colours, embellishments and accessories keeping in mind that they need to be suitable for a baby.
